Sexual and Gender Diversity in Ageing: Care, Health and Resistance of GBTQ Men and Non-binary People

Deadline: 31 January 2023

Dear Colleagues,

In recent years, aging has become an important concern in government and research agendas. However, there is a gap in the literature on ageing and health, particularly with regard to health-related issues affecting older gay, bisexual, transgender or queer men and non-binary people (GBTQ*).

Based on the understanding that there are specific challenges directly affecting a rapidly growing population, this special issue is focused on the impact of legal bans, pathologization, and social stigma, on care, health and wellbeing of older GBTQ* people.

More specifically, we are interested in proposals concerned with health-related policy frameworks and/or biographic experiences relating to the care, health and wellbeing of older GBTQ* people. This includes those who have experienced the impacts of homo-, bi-, and transphobia; those who have encountered good practices that could be transferred elsewhere; and those whose experiences of resistance in the medico-legal sphere can indicate possible directions for social transformation.

Relevant aspects include, but are not restricted to, the following: $\sqrt{}$ critical perspectives of health-related policies and politics for older GBTQ* people

 $\sqrt{}$ impact and strategies of resistance to the pathologization of sexual orientation and gender identity in older GBTQ* people

 $\sqrt{}$ impact of HIV/aids related experiences and public policy in older GBTQ* people

 $\sqrt{}$ health-related consequences (mental or other) of the criminalization of sexual or gender diversity for currently older GBTQ* people

 $\sqrt{}$ intersections of ageing, health and subaltern masculinities

 $\sqrt{}$ intersections of GBTQ* ageing, disability and chronic illness

 $\sqrt{}$ healthcare provision for older GBTQ* people (including good practices)

 $\sqrt{}$ health-related stigma affecting older GBTQ* people (misdiagnosis, serophobia, medical gaslighting, etc.) JOMH Editorial Office
